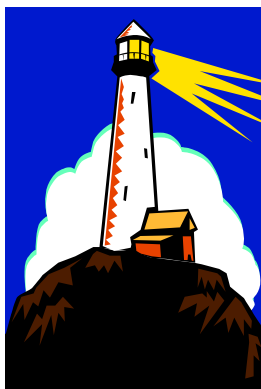
APRIL 14TH PROGRAM

Make a Great Portrait

Making a great photo is not a snap. It takes preparation and patience---and the ability to think of your subject as a star.

TELL A STORY Know what you want to say with the shot beforehand. Once you decide how you want the subject to be portrayed, you must move around to get it. Try to think of your subject and then find an angle or background the goes with him or her. If you're trying to make someone look jolly and happy, you have to get him or her to genuinely to laugh. You have to be the instigator for the picture.

SET UP YOUR SHOT Make sure all the technical elements are at your beck and call-that your flash is turned on and you're zoomed in. Never shoot from below: always get slightly higher than your subject. And never take a photo of someone sitting in a reclining chair. Their belly will be closer to the camera than their head, and they'll appear to have a large tummy. As Ken Hanson said in his Backyard Bird Photography workshop last month, focus on the eyes. And last but not least, shoot a bunch of shots and present the best ones to your subject. That's what the pros do.
